The research evidence should help inform the policy decisions of the Sierra Leone Local Content Agency.

About the role

Tasks are likely to include but not limited to:

- Working on a range of research projects related to employment promotion and skills developments in the context of Sierra Leone.
- Discussing and agreeing on research project requirements with supervisor;
- Writing papers, report and research summaries for both internal and external audiences
- Engage with key stakeholders in government, local councils, academic institutions, the private sectors and donor partners
- Ensuring quality control of research;
- Providing information and analysis on a policy issues and its developments
- Keeping up to date with developments in policy and employment and skills development issues in Sierra Leone
- Delivering presentations at conferences and workshops
- All other related duties as assigned.

Education

- Advanced University degree from an accredited University (preferably a post-graduate degree) in law, economics, public administration, business or social science related discipline; or an equivalent combination of education, training and a minimum of 5 years directly relevant experience.
